Since the start of the Covid pandemic and the advent of virtual, rather than inperson meetings, opportunities to share and/or compete printed images have largely disappeared. Some larger competitions organized by PSA still exist. Judges gather in one location, such as Deleware for the competition for which I am one of a number of judges (PSA Phototravel competition). Accepted images and winners will be displyed at this year's PSA Festival in a print gallery. The result will be several hundred high quality prints on display. At this time it is too late for entering some PSA division competitions, but four opportunities still are open.

Since this year's festival is relatively nearby in Wiliamsburg, Virginia and can be reached by auto rtherthan flying, this is a great opportunity for NIH club members to try a PSA festival and experience the genuine fun and learning aspects of PSA.

Full Details About the Competition

If you would like to enter your images for the Color and Monochrome Images of the Year competitions, here is the information you need:

1. You may enter up to 2 images in the Color Competition and up to 2 images in the Monochrome Competition.

2. The image(s) you enter must be ones that you submitted to one of our club competitions or critiques during this club year (2022-2023).

- 3. The image(s) do not have to have won an award.
- 4. There are no novice or advanced classes in the year-end competition.
- 5. Judging is done by your fellow club members using a numerical rating system.
- 6. No points are awarded to the winners of this competition.

Submitting Images

Submit your entries at the NIH Camera Club website. Choose either the Color or Monochrome competition as appropriate for the competition date of June 13, 2023. The deadline to submit your images is Sunday, June 4, 2023, before 11:59 p.m.

Voting: Everyone in the club will receive a link to vote in the competition. Voting ends on Sunday, June 11, 2023.

What to Know about the Presentations

We are accepting presentations of a length not to exceed 5 minutes from any club member who wishes to share. The images you share do not need to have been submitted during the year and can be any subject you wish to share. You may present them yourself or create a slideshow that auto-advances with or without narration.

First Place: "The Arch" By Goutam Sen

Second Place: " Day of the Dead Mourning" By Nancy Axelrod

This image is of a woman during an all night vigil at the grave of a loved one in the Santa Maria Atzompa cemetery outside of Oaxaca, Mexico. She is surrounded by lighted candles and marigolds. Sony a6000 camera with a 30mm lens (45mm equivalent). 1/125", f/1.4, ISO 1600.



Third Place: "Room at Night" By Doug Wolters



HM: "Lavender and Stars" By Nancy Axelrod

This image was made in the Valensole Plain in Provence, France. The area was so isolated that the stars, including the Milky Way, were prominent and the only light pollution was two red dots and a bright band near the horizon, which I eliminated

in post. The spectacular lavender plants, which were only in bloom for a couple of weeks, were illuminated by painting with a flashlight. Sony a6400 camera (APS-C) with a Sony 10-18mm lens at 11mm (16mm equivalent), 13", f/4.0, ISO 4000. This was straight out of the camera except for the post-processing noted above.



HM: "Lincoln Memorial by Night" By Michael Tran

I was visiting the memorial once of the beautiful evening, soon I stepped into the lobby my eyes caught on lighting of all the cellphones whose were aiming to the statute for photo snapshots.

First Place: "Inspection" By Michael Tran

There was a small fish sauce factory in town, Inspector was inspecting fish sauce after the sunset to make sure no contamination prior harvest time.



Second Place: "Havana Cathedral " By Stan Collyer

Seven years ago, I had a memorable trip to Cuba, organized by Santa Fe Workshops. It was one of the best photo excursions I've been on, due to the expertise of the local guides. We went on several pre-dawn walks, in what appeared to me as rather sketchy areas. Fortunately, in those days Havana was remarkably safe, compared to many U.S. cities. In this photo, I was in a square on a very windy morning. I needed a long exposure, hence the blurry palms in front of the cathedral. Shot on a tripod, with a 16mm lens, for 2 seconds at f/8, ISO 400.



Third Place: "NY Skyline" By Dale Lewis

The NY Skyline photo was taken from Brooklyn on the night of 9/10/22. I always wanted to be in NY around 9/11 to see the illumination of the two laser lights in the sky representing the twin towers and those lost lives. This photo was taken at night with a Canon EOS 6D Mark II at the following settings: 1/180 sec at f/22, ISO 100, 100 mm (EF 100-400 mm f/4.5-5.6 L IS II USM). It was processed in Lightroom and Topaz Denoise AI. It was converted to monochrome in Lightroom.

I wondered if 2080 was a typo but learned that Nepal has a different calendar than the U.S. and 2080 was, in fact, correct. Holi. which is also known as "Festival of Colors, Festival of Spring, and Festival of Love", was celebrated as well. According to the Nepali calendar, the actual date of Holi, which is celebrated by Hindu religion, was March 6. People smeared colored powder on the faces and clothes of friends and families.
